INTRODUCTION OF NEW ZOO BOARD MEMBER, KYLE BINKLEY

Introductions of the Board members were made to Mr. Binkley. Mr. Binkley then introduced himself and he talked about how he works for the State and went to LCC, is from the Lansing area and graduated from Everett High School.

OLD BUSINESS

Moose Exhibit Update

Mrs. Graham stated there is nothing new to report at this time, but they continue to work with Safari Club International. They sent a letter out to the State Chair and are looking to send one to the local chair. Dr. Chris Brown works with them and knows them all well.

Hospital Financials

Mrs. Graham stated there is a check in the mail from the MSU Vet School. They have been invoiced for \$118,000 which is for the schematic rendering to help with the fundraising.

Strategic Planning

Chair Groen stated they are meeting regularly and Mrs. Jill Garnett has been chosen as the staff person and to gather raw data to establish a timeline for staff involvement. There will be a number of focus groups in regards to conservation and preservation of animals and need to get customers opinions.

Mrs. Graham said this plan will have the emphasis on conservation. Mrs. Garnett manages the BIG Zoo Lesson. She's not a management and deals with everyone on the staff posing no threat to anybody.

Discussion of Change of Meeting Dates

Chair Groen stated this item is due to Mr. Kibbey being on another Board on the same night and wondered if there might be another timeframe that would work for everyone else.

Mr. Kibbey stated that his is also on the City Parks Board which meets on the same night at 7:00 pm and this is a conflict. He said he could submit his resignation because it is not fair that he comes for only 45 minutes.

Discussion ensued. It was agreed to change the meeting time from 6:00 pm to 5:45 pm.

NEW BUSINESS

Offer Military Discount

Mrs. Graham had asked if there's a possibility of offering a military discount. She's received a call from a lady with the Michigan National Guards to see if we could do something for the Month of April.

Commissioner Tsernoglou asked would we do yearlong discounts and make April a military month.

Mrs. Graham asked if it would that require a resolution or could it be handled administratively. She said she would like to offer a discount all year long.

Commissioner Nolan said we are rated 49th state to give veterans a discount. She suggested having Mrs. Graham contact the Veterans Affairs Department to see what they suggest.

Mrs. Graham said she would also send it out on the Directors listsery to see what other zoos do.

Pavilion Use by Ingham County School Groups

Mrs. Graham talked about the resolution in regards to the Ingham County school groups using the pavilions for free. They don't always reserve it and there is staff time involved with the cleanup, etc. She would like to charge \$25.

Chair Groen asked does anyone have any reservations, and if not then Mrs. Graham can get something together for a resolution. Everyone was in agreement.

Set Date for Tour & Dinner

Mrs. Graham stated last year we had a tour and dinner for the Board and would like to do this again. She wanted to know if they wanted to do this on a meeting night or some other time.

It was agreed, the Zoo Board meeting date of May 14th would include a light dinner and a tour.

Kevin Feuka

Chair Groen asked if there were any suggestions for celebrating his years of service on the Board.

Mrs. Graham stated there needs to be a resolution.

Commissioner Nolan said it would be nice if he could come on May 14th to have a special time to honor him.

Mrs. Graham said he has served on the Society Board for 14 years and on the Zoo Board for six years.

Commissioner Nolan asked Mrs. Graham if she could get a resolution done for him.

ZOO DIRECTORS REPORT

Mrs. Graham said she just got back from Santa Barbara which was a great place to go for the director's conference. While at the conference, they talked a lot about conservation and the idea is if you are exhibiting endangered animals, you should be talking to your patrons about conservation of their natural habitat in the wild. She would like to do "Quarters for Conservation" which you can vote with tokens or use quarters to vote for a favorite conservation program. She said AZA is suggesting when you exhibit a specific species, 10% of the cost of the exhibit should be for field research of that species. AZA would also like to see 3% of operating budget given to support field research. She also talked about the BIG Zoo Lesson, camel vendors, the mock wedding, and the communications center where there will be someone dispatching and answers the phone.

Mr. Halfmann went over the zoo financial reports. He said there wasn't much going on last month according to the financial statement. There are some controllable and non-controllable expenses missing. Page 4, has the final December numbers with more transactions coming from the County level which is a 244 positive and not a negative 3,177. There was an increase in permanent accruals and controllable expenses and more in the prelim for animal care and facilities which were a part of the \$70,000 increase. At the end of 2013, the fund balance is \$1.7 million.

BOARD COMMENTS

Mrs. Leys asked if the employees will be taking advantage of the San Diego Zoo Global Academy. She also asked about the Volunteer Garden Program at the zoo. She knew that Mrs. Garnett was spear heading it, but she stepped out of it last year and then she was the only volunteer. Spring is coming and she wanted to throw it out there to maybe find a better way to manage and recruit for

Mrs. Graham said Mrs. Horvatin and Mr. Davidek have had some conversation about how to coordinate this program and she suggested going to the Saginaw Children's Zoo.

RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES TRUST FUND FOR AN ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND AT POTTER PARK

WHEREAS, the Ingham County Parks Facility Master Plan was developed under the direction of the Ingham County Board of Commissioners to establish a systematic plan to meet the goal of providing adequate recreational facilities for the residents of Ingham County; and

WHEREAS, constructing an accessible playground at Potter Park was included in the 2012-2016 Parks Facility Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, CASE CARES, a community based foundation of the Case Credit Union, offered to construct an accessible playground at Potter Park at no cost to the County; and

WHEREAS, CASE CARES has held several fundraising events and secured donations and grants towards the construction of the playground and supports the Ingham County Park's Department application for Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) Trust Fund Grant for Potter Park; and

WHEREAS, CASE CARES has agreed to donate \$70,000 as the necessary 25% match for the grant; and

WHEREAS, the Ingham County Parks Department will be the recipient of the grant funds and will assist in the administration of the grant, thus limiting staff time of the Potter Park Zoo management team; and

WHEREAS, the playground construction oversight will be provided by Potter Park Zoo staff and volunteers will be utilized to minimize staff time, and

WHEREAS, if the grant application is approved, construction of the playground will take place during 2015.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Potter Park Zoo Board recommends to the Ingham County Board of Commissioners that a grant application be submitted to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Trust Fund for the construction of an accessible playground at Potter Park.

Re: Playground grant application

In 2008, CASE CARES, a 501c3 of the Case Credit Union, approached the County to request the opportunity to construct an accessible playground within one our parks. At the time, Potter Park was a perfect fit, as the infrastructure was in place to make this a successful project. The site provides for accessible parking, restrooms and pathways that would allow for easy access for all.

Unfortunately, the CASE CARES Board found that fundraising is much more difficult than they had planned and securing adequate funding for the project has taken much longer than they ever imagined. Over the last 5+ years they have held several fundraising events, including an event at the Zoo last summer. At this point, they have secured \$70,000 toward the project which has a total cost of approximately \$190,000.

This playground will be constructed adjacent to the existing playground, creating an exciting, colorful play area for children of all abilities. The surfacing will be a rubber based product similar to the existing playground, which will provide for the necessary safety features for fall protection yet provide the best and easiest surface for accessibility.

The Parks Department will assist with the administration of the grant to limit additional work on the management team at Potter Park. Construction will be done by volunteers with some preliminary site work to be done by County staff.

Overall, there will be little to no cost to the County for this incredible playground and with the rubber surfacing and newly designed play equipment; long term maintenance will be at a minimum.

I have attached a drawing of the playground for reference and will attend the March Zoo Board meeting to address any questions. I respectfully request approval of this resolution to allow for the opportunity to complete this playground project.




